

Immanuel Jakobovitz (1921–1999)

THE JEWISH COMMUNITY of Great Britain, and, indeed, that of the Commonwealth, can feel justified pride in having as their spiritual leader a scholar of the first water, a man of deeply civilised mind and feeling, unswerving integrity and, above all, living faith and exemplary courage in interpreting the traditional values of Judaism in their application to the spiritual and political problems which today beset Jews individually and collectively. Example is better than precept: Sir Immanuel Jakobovits has shown admirable independence and fearless moral strength in resisting the forces of fanaticism and extremism, both theological and political, which threaten the future both of Israel and of the Diaspora.
